Celebrating Beloved Teachers

Our teachers are our greatest asset at St. Eugene School. Their talent and dedication lead our students to academic success, while their compassion creates the family feeling that sets our school apart. With bittersweet emotions, we celebrated the following teachers at a retirement party following their final school Mass in June. Principal Rebecca Jones praised their contributions as educators and role models. Students, parents, and alumni contributed to memory books and socialized with the retirees afterward.

Mary Jane Tulley is a legend at St. Eugene School! Beginning in 1970, she taught hundreds of students, and even the parents of some current students, at the intermediate and middle school levels. Her special focus was social studies. When guiding our students to draw maps, construct Egyptian tombs, and create Revolutionary War news broadcasts, she brought history to life. She also moderated Math Olympiads as an after-school co-curricular, regularly leading our contestants to score in the top 2%-10% of the nation.

Joe Mirasola taught third grade at St. Eugene for 20 years. For the annual science fair, he motivated students to dream up a project idea, run an experiment, record results, and present their findings to the school

community. Field trips to the EAA were another highlight, and he logged many happy hours with our after-care students.

Karen Prendergast spent 15 years as our 8th grade homeroom and

middle school English, language arts, and literature teacher. Affectionately nicknamed "The Grammar Police," Mrs. P. made it her mission to ensure our students are well spoken and know the many rules of comma usage. Students will remember her love of her favorite book, *To Kill a Mockingbird*.

Margy Slattery has served our school for 15 years. She initially shared the role of school secretary and introduced Worship Circle as a supplement to our religion curriculum. In recent years, her role evolved to include Christian service coordinator. Mrs. Slattery trained older students to lead Worship Circle, organized service projects for all grade levels, facilitated the Living Rosary and Living Stations of the Cross, and created the Shining Light Service Club.

We thank these retiring teachers for their many gifts to our school community and ask God to bless them on their next adventures. They will be missed.

GUIDING HEARTS AND GROWING MINDS FOR SIXTY YEARS

Our commitment to raising children in the Catholic faith while providing exemplary academics has been stead-fast since the first students entered in September of 1959. Some methods have changed; others have stayed the same. As founding pastor Fr. Mackin would say, the spirit of St. Eugene endures.



Students of all generations have enjoyed classroom visits by our priests. Today, Fr. Paul Hartmann deftly handles Q & A on sometimes unexpected topics. Homilies at weekly school Masses are always child-friendly.

Technology is an ever-changing tool for educators, and we've been on the cutting edge for decades. Our current 1:1 iPad program, with techbooks replacing some textbooks, facilitates differentiated instruction to challenge all learners.

Educating the whole child involves learning support programs, co-curriculars, and specialty classes. Pitch pipes may have been replaced by Orff instruments and African drums, but the thrill of making music together hasn't changed.

During Advent, today's 8th graders conduct weekly candlelit prayer services and take the lead in the annual Christmas concert. A shepherd's robe has always been appropriate attire on the altar.

Service projects still include Thanksgiving collections. Today's students also perform onsite tasks at food banks, senior homes, and literacy centers.

The church interior has been remodeled, and another facelift is in the works now, thanks to the recent parish capital campaign. In October, school families and parishioners experience a Living Rosary with students in sashes representing the beads and speaking the prayers and reflections aloud. The heart of our St. Eugene School community will always be found in our shared worship experiences.







Make Way for the STEAM Rollers!

What's trending at St. Eugene School? Four new STEAM Rollers! These mobile carts are filled with ideas and supplies for developing science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM) skills. Our students are now taking their STEM education to the next level, appreciating how the arts contribute to the inventions of today and tomorrow. In some cases, they're even teaching their teachers a thing or two.

This fleet of STEAM Rollers is the brainchild of Sharon Webster, the St. Eugene STEAM Director and algebra teacher. Mrs. Webster applied for and received a grant from the G.I.F.T.S. program – *Grant Initiatives for Today's Students* – which was created in honor of the 175th anniversary of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. That grant funded the creation of three carts. A generous gift from the Class of 2019 allowed the addition of a fourth cart.

Each STEAM roller has a focus area. The builders cart is stocked with a wide variety of art and building supplies including Legos and recycled household objects. Recently, the builders cart rolled into the first grade classroom where students designed and built musical instruments.





The robotics STEAM roller facilitates exploration of programming and robotics. It houses several Sphero robots and rovers programmed with iPads and iPods. Eighth graders are learning to program in TI Basic on their graphing calculators, including writing code for rover cars. Middle school students used Spheros to demonstrate coding during a faculty meeting in October.

The 3D design STEAM roller holds geometric solids and manipulatives for transformation, a 3D printer, and sample projects. During the spring Business Fair, Tinkercad designs will now truly take shape. The VR/AR cart contains materials for virtual and augmented reality projects such as learning about plate tectonics using merge cubes in sixth grade science class. Exploring ancient Egypt on a virtual field trip makes for a unique social studies class as well.

Mrs. Webster guides our teachers with integrating the STEAM Rollers into the curriculum. Middle school members of the "STEAM team" are trained to assist during power hour sessions. Many STEAM books have been added to our library. Using the Seesaw app, students from fourth through eighth grade share their creations to inspire makers in every grade.

Collaborative, imaginative, instructive...the possibilities are endless with the St. Eugene STEAM Rollers!
